

A World of Welsh Copper

Welsh copper has an ancient heritage. Over 4000 years ago the first miners extracted ore from the mountains of central and northern Wales. By the Industrial Revolution of the 18th and 19th centuries Swansea lay at the heart of Wales's historic copper industry. The rich coal reserves surrounding the south Welsh ports, including Llanelli and Neath, ensured they were the most profitable centres in Britain and the world for smelting and refining.



Copper was at the centre of integrated multinational business networks stretching from Anglesey to Australia and Cornwall to Chile. Welsh copper was exported to markets across the continents. Some of it also financed the transatlantic slave trade. Welsh mariners (Cape Horners) circled the globe to ply the world copper trade.

The copper industry has left its mark on Swansea. You can find it in place names such as Vivian, Morris and Grenfell, as well as in the few industrial remains on the banks of the River Tawe. By 1961 the valley was the most derelict industrial landscape in Europe. The Lower Swansea Valley Project transformed this 'moonscape' into a 'greenscape'.

In 2010/11 Swansea University with other partners is undertaking a project to raise awareness of Wales's rich copper heritage. Funded by the Economic and Social Research Council, the Global and Local Worlds of Welsh Copper Project aims to leave a legacy of increased access to historical information about the copper industry in Wales.

Byd Copr Cymru

Mae gan gopr Cymru dreftadaeth hynafol. Dros 4000 o flynyddoedd yn ôl cloddiodd y mwyngloddwyr cyntaf fwyn o fynyddoedd canolbarth a gogledd Cymru. Erbyn Chwyldro Diwydiannol y 18fed a'r 19eg ganrif roedd Abertawe yn ganolog i ddiwydiant copr hanesyddol Cymru. Roedd y cyflenwadau glo cyfoethog oedd yn amgylchynu porthladdoedd de Cymru, yn cynnwys Llanelli a Chastell-nedd, yn sicrhau mai dyma'r canolfannau mwyaf proffidiol ym Mhrydain a'r byd ar gyfer mwyndoddi a choethi.



Roedd copr yn ganolog i rwydweithiau busnes rhwngwladol integredig yn ymestyn o Sir Fôn i Awstralia ac o Gernyw i Chile. Roedd copr Cymru'n cael ei allforio i farchnadoedd ar draws y cyfandiroedd. Roedd peth ohono hefyd yn ariannu'r fasnach gaethweision ar draws Môr Iwerydd. Roedd morwyr o Gymru (Morwyr yr Horn) yn hwyliau o amgylch y byd i wthio masnach copr y byd.

Mae'r diwydiant copr wedi gadael ei ôl ar Abertawe. Fe'i gwelwch mewn enwau llefydd megis Vivian, Morris a Grenfell yn ogystal ag yn yr ychydig olion diwydiannol ar lannau Afon Tawe. Erbyn 1961, y cwm oedd y dirwedd ddiwydiannol fwyaf diffaith yn Ewrop. Bu Prosiect Cwm Tawe Isaf yn gyfrifol am drawsffurio'r tir anghyfannedd hwn yn dir gwyrdd.

Yn 2010/11 mae Prifysgol Abertawe gyda phartneriaid eraill yn cynnal prosiect i godi ymwybyddiaeth o dreftadaeth gyfoethog copr Cymru, wedi'i gyllido gan y Cyngor Ymchwil Economaidd a Chymdeithasol. Nod Prosiect Bydoedd Lleol a Byd-eang Copr Cymru yw ei gwneud hi'n haws mynd at wybodaeth hanesyddol am y diwydiant copr yng Nghymru.
